

Year 7 Catch Up Funding 2015 / 16

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve at least level 4 in reading and/or mathematics at the end of key stage 2 (KS2).

The academy's catch up premium allocation for the current academic year is £12,000

Analysis of Catch – up premium spending 2015/ 2016
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KS2 to achieve at least a Level 4c by the end of Year 7

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Impact of the spending on the attainment of Year 7 students in 2015/2016

There are a total number of 27 students who were entitled to Catch Funding. Of those 27, 5 were entitled to it for both English and Maths.

Subject	Number of students entitled to the catch up premium	% of eligible students who attained level 4 by the end of year 7
English	14	79%
Mathematics	17	88%

For the students who didn't achieve a L4, there is further planned intervention for year 8.
