Topics Studied:

Unit 3: Criminal Law (Offences against the Person) to include murder, manslaughter, non-fatal offences and defences.

Unit 4: Criminal Law (Offences against Property) to include theft, robbery, burglary, blackmail, fraud, criminal damage. Concepts of Law to include law and morals, law and justice and fault.

Unit 3 is predominantly delivered in the autumn term, with Unit 4 predominantly delivered in the spring term. There should be an opportunity for revision and final examination practice in the summer term before the examinations in June.

Exam Board:

Year 13 students follow the AQA GCE in Law specification.

Assessment structure:

Unit 3: 25% of A level externally assessed unit.

Unit 4: 25% of A level externally assessed unit.

Both external examinations will be taken in June of Year 13.

There is no controlled assessment or coursework.
