What are your children doing online?



Students are more interactive than ever before

A 2013 survey of 825 children aged 7-16 and their parents found:

- On average, children were spending two hours a day online (75% of their parents thought they spent less than an hour online a day)
- 1 in 7 under-16s spend more than 4 hours a day online.
- 66% of the children surveyed said they'd had a negative experience online but only 22% of parents realised this.
- Over 50% of the children surveyed said they had accidentally accessed inappropriate content online. 11% said they had done this deliberately.
- 5% of the children surveyed said they had met up with someone they had met online.
- 1 in 8 children surveyed admitted that they accessed the internet in secret even when they had been banned from using the internet by their parents.

What can parents/carers do?

Parental controls.

Software such as Norton Family. Free and subscription versions provide services such as:

- Filtering
- Time limits
- Reporting

But...

Parental controls will never be able to protect your child completely – your home is not the only place that they will be accessing the internet.

What can parents/carers do?

Talk to your child about what they are doing online.

Talk to your child about what they share – you wouldn't give your phone number to a person on the street, how is a stranger online any different?

Talk to them about who they are chatting to on gaming sites and the issues around friend requests from strangers.

Talk to them about their privacy online – usernames, images - Anything submitted online is potentially there for everybody, forever.

Talk to them about snapchat and make them aware that images can easily be screenshot by other people.

Talk to them about their digital footprint

Talk to them about what they are looking at online. Have they seen anything that has upset them? Do they know what cyberbullying is and how to report it?

Talk to them about the law and the implications of what might be shared online between them and their friends.

What can parents/carers do?

Agree Rules

Which sites and apps can your child use?

When is it okay to use the internet?

Does your child need to ask for permission to download games or make in-app purchases?

Do they need their mobile phone or access to the internet when they go to bed?

When are they allowed to play on their X-box or Playstation?

There are numerous links that you may find useful on the school website:-

The Child Exploitation and Online Protection (CEOP) is responsible for protecting children from harm, both online and offline. It's ThinkUKnow website has extensive advice relating to any concerns you may have regarding your child's safety.

Educate Against Hate is a government website which gives parents practical advice on protecting children from extremism and radicalisation. It explains how people become radicalised and helps parents to recognise the warning signs for their own children.

The See Me, Hear Me campaign is coordinated by local councils and West Midlands Police to raise awareness of child sexual exploitation. The See Me, Hear Me website has advice on how to spot the signs of CSE and on how to report it.
