COVID-19 Guidance – if a member of your household has symptoms and is awaiting a test result

Do not send your child to school – please be reminded that if a member of your household is awaiting a COVID-19 test due to having symptoms, the <u>whole household should isolate</u> until the test result is received, and students <u>must not</u> return to school until a negative test result is received. Please advise school of the reason for the

absence as COVID-19 absences are exempt from usual attendance processes.

<u>COVID-19 Guidance – if your child has</u> <u>symptoms and is awaiting a test result</u>

Do not send your child to school – please be reminded that if your child has a COVID-19 test due to having symptoms, they <u>must not</u> return to school until the test result is received. We do not require evidence of a negative test, but do require evidence of a positive result. Please advise school of the reason for the absence as COVID-19 absences are exempt from usual attendance processes.



Ventilation in Classrooms

In order to ensure adequate ventilation in classrooms, please be advised that windows will need to remain open during winter months and students should come to school wearing a plain black V-neck jumper and wear appropriate under layers as they will not be allowed to wear their coats. Hoodies and slogan jumpers remain prohibited items and will be confiscated.

Remembrance Day 2020

Every year, The Royal British Legion calls on the nation to unite in commemorating Remembrance Sunday. Owing to the COVID-19 pandemic, the annual Remembrance Sunday march past the Cenotaph will not take place this year. The Royal British Legion recognise this will be deeply disappointing for all who were due to take part. Despite the changes this year, they are encouraging people across the nations to ensure Remembrance Sunday is still marked appropriately by taking part in remote and socially distanced Remembrance activity.

Students at Fairfax will take part in a virtual remembrance assembly on Wednesday, 11 November 2020, and we encourage everyone in our community to observe the two-minute silence at home or on your doorstep on Sunday, 8 November 2020 at 11:00am.

Children in Need 2020

A reminder notice: there will be a non-uniform day on Friday, 13 November to fundraise for Children in Need. Students will be able to pay £1 to wear their own clothes.

Wet and Cold Winter Weather

A reminder notice: as students are bubbled, and spend much of their time in the same classroom, we are keen to ensure that students are able to get outside and get some fresh air at break and lunchtime.



During wet and cold weather, we would ask that you **equip your child with a waterproof coat and/or umbrella** in order to ensure they are able to have a break outside. We know that being in the fresh air benefits well-being. If you have any concerns, please do not hesitate to contact your child's Assistant Head of Year or Head of Year.

In addition, as we move into winter, we will need to keep classrooms well ventilated and ask that students are sent to school with appropriate plain base layers and a black V-neck jumper. Hoodies are not acceptable and remain a prohibited item in school.

PE Lessons – Winter Months/Health and Safety

A reminder notice: with the colder months ahead, we kindly remind parents that students are permitted to wear the following to keep them warm during PE lessons:

- Girls are allowed to wear black base layers underneath their PE skort and House polo shirt along with a black Fairfax fleece or the new black Fairfax mid layer
- Boys are allowed to wear long sleeved black base layer underneath their PE tops, and base layer black shorts under their shorts along with the new black Fairfax mid layer

2020-21 Standards Reminders

Uniform A reminder notice: full school uniform should be worn. The girls' Fairfax trouser or skirt is compulsory. Trainers are not permitted.

Hair A reminder notice: natural hair colours only. Extreme haircuts, including tramlines in haircuts or eyebrows, are not permitted. Any hair accessories or adornments must be black.

Nails A reminder notice: short, natural nails only.

Piercings A reminder notice: we allow one small stud in each ear. Any other piercings are unacceptable and must be removed for school.

Nose Studs A reminder notice: nose studs are not allowed and must be removed for school.

There have been some changes to the Year 9 day in order to allow for five one-hour lessons with no interruption. The Year 9 break time has moved from 09:35 to 09:55 and is on the main playground. Lunch has moved from 12:45 to 12:15 and is also on the main playground.
