Following the disruption of school closures due to the global pandemic, the government have awarded two catch up grants for schools to use to support students in catching up on their learning. The 6th form grant is allocated based on deprivation and the 11-16 grant allocated at a fixed cost of £80 per child.

Schools are free to spend the Covid grant as they see fit. However, they are accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support students affected by Covid-19.
