

Statutory Relationships and Sex Education

A reminder notice: for September 2021, the government have introduced a new statutory relationships and sex education curriculum. The details about this can be found at <u>www.gov.uk</u>. It is compulsory for all schools to deliver this from September 2021.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

At Fairfax Academy we believe that excellent attendance and punctuality are the key to success. A missed school day is a lost opportunity to learn. Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve higher grades than students who do not have regular attendance.



Children are required by law to attend school 190 days per year and the Government advise that students' attendance should be at least 95%. However, 95% attendance equates to 10 missed days of school; a massive 50 lessons1 Research has shown that students missing 20 days of school performed a whole grade lower in their exams than similar ability students with good attendance.



Wherever possible appointments should be made out of school time. We understand that at times appointments in the school day are unavoidable. Please provide evidence of the appointment in advance, so that we can amend our school records, and advise the school who will be collecting your child during the school day.

HOLIDAYS IN TERM TIME



Poor punctuality can have a significant impact on learning time. Across a school year, being **5 minutes late per** day results in a loss of **3 days learning per year**. Being **15 minutes** late every day will result in **10 lost days**.

Our school day starts at 8.35am and students should be through the school gate at this time. Students that are late into school will be issued with sanctions in line with our academy Behaviour and Discipline Policy.

ATTENDANCE

At Fairfax Academy we are committed to challenging poor attendance. In cases where a student begins to develop a pattern of absence, the academy will advise the parents/carers that we require an improvement in attendance.

When attendance fails to improve, the school reluctantly takes the line that legal action has to be considered, and the Court Section in Birmingham becomes involved. So far this academic year, seven cases have been heard, and either a fixed penally has been issued, or a court appearance has been determined as an appropriate course of action.

Standards Reminder

Punctuality A reminder notice: punctuality is a very important aspect of life. This is a key focus for Fairfax Academy as we prepare our students for the world of work, where there will be high expectations of attendance and punctuality. Registration begins at 08:35, and so we advise students to be in school no later than 08:30. Students who arrive later than 08:35 can expect to receive a same day after school detention for 45 minutes.

Hair A reminder notice: natural hair colours only. Extreme haircuts, including tramlines in haircuts or eyebrows, are not permitted.

Piercings A reminder notice: we allow one small stud in each ear – small hooped earrings are not permitted. Any other piercings are unacceptable and must be removed for school.

Nose Studs A reminder notice: nose studs are not allowed and must be removed for school.

Uniform A reminder notice: students who are unable to conform to our uniform policy will be provided with uniform to wear, until the issue can be rectified, and parents will be contacted about this if the need arises. We want our students to have the highest standards and this includes adhering to our uniform policy. We thank parents and carers very much for supporting our high expectations.

An advance notice: please be advised that all Year 7 students will be completing a Cognitive Abilities Test (CAT) w/b 4 October 2021. It involves three 45-minute multiple choice tests, and these will be completed in the classroom on Monday, 4 October, Thursday, 7 October and Friday, 8 October. Students will be asked a range of questions to assess their verbal, non-verbal, spatial and quantitative reasoning. The results of the assessment will help us support your child during their time at Fairfax as it provides us with useful information about how they learn. The CAT assessment is something that students cannot do any preparation for and they should not worry about it all. Fairfax simply want students to complete the questions on the day, as best as they can, so that we get an accurate assessment of their abilities and how they learn.
