Sparx Maths

- Sparx Maths is our new online learning platform.
- Research form Cambridge University shows it does help students make progress.
- Weekly homework will be set every Wednesday, completed for following Wednesday.
- Students need to watch the introductory videos first that will explain how to use Sparx maths
- Weekly parental updates with how your child is progressing with homework
- Students will be set weekly tasks alongside other homework from lessons
- Students will need to complete a number of tasks and then sparx will personalise the level and difficulty so initially they may find too easy or too difficult- it will automatically adjust.
- Sparx will also include times table or consolidation from previous topics so will automatically personalise learning and level.
- Weekly prizes awarded to help encourage/reward.
- Students are awarded XP points for homework and booster points available
- Sparx Club Tuesday 3pm in B5.

How do I keep my child safe online?

What age should I speak to my child about online safety?

How do I keep up with an ever-changing online landscape?

Will Gardener, CEO of Childnet, and Suzanne Taylor, Assistant Director Impact - Child Sexual Abuse & Exploitation at Barnardo's, provided the below guidance around E-Safety and how parents/ carers can keep their children safe online.

While the internet has created fantastic new opportunities for children to learn, play and connect, we know it has created some big risks as well.

A 2021 Office for National Statistics (ONS) report found that nearly a third of children had accepted a friend request from someone they did not know and around 1 in 10 children (11%) aged 13 to 15 years reported receiving a sexual message, while 1 in 100 reported sending a sexual message.

What types of harms do I need to be aware of as a parent?

There are different types of inappropriate, concerning and illegal content online. From bullying, violent videos and 'sexting' to blackmail.

Children tell us that they can be quickly exposed to content they didn't search out whilst on their personal devices.

The Child Exploitation and Online Protection Command (CEOP) have some great animations to show younger children. Plus, they're split into age brackets with key messages you can revisit as a parent

Which parental control tools are recommended? What features should they include?

Childnet would recommend putting parental controls on the home Wi-Fi and all devices that your children might use. Key features to look out for are content restrictions (to block things like pornography), in-app purchases and time limits.

Internet Matters has step-by-step guides on how to put many of these in place.

Whilst parental controls will reduce the chances of your child seeing something they're not ready for, inappropriate content can still get through. Supervise younger children and keep talking about their online lives. It is also a good idea to test the parental controls yourself and adapt them as your children get older.

Barnardo's have partnered with Vodafone who have some good suggestions on leading by example.

As a parent, how can you stay up to date with platforms, such as TikTok, Snapchat, Instagram, and their safety and settings.

The dangers that pose the most risk to your child will depend a lot on how they use the internet, what is already being done to keep them safe, and what they already know about using the internet safely and responsibly.

Advice would be:

- Equip yourself with some basic knowledge by using internet sites
- Ask your child to show you what new apps are
- Speak with other parents or older teens to see what they are doing online

Vodafone also have shared <u>5 apps every parent should know about.</u>

Keeping your child safe online

Our key advice to you as parents and carers:

Talk to your child about what they are doing online.

Talk to your child about what they share – you wouldn't give your phone number to a person on the street, how is a stranger online any different?

Talk to them about who they are chatting to on gaming sites and the issues around friend requests from strangers.

Talk to them about their privacy online – usernames, images - Anything submitted online is potentially there for everybody, forever.

Talk to them about snapchat and make them aware that images can easily be screenshot by other people.

Talk to them about their digital footprint

Talk to them about what they are looking at online. Have they seen anything that has upset them? Do they know what cyberbullying is and how to report it?

Talk to them about the law and the implications of what might be shared online between them and their friends.
