These routines have been shared in tutor time regularly since the start of the academic year to set out our expectations for the benefit of all. Our routines also focus on the behaviours we expect and do not want whilst around the site, with reinforcement on littering and respect of the school and each other.

Students who meet our school expectations are rightly acknowledged for their positive contributions and achievements. To date, students have received 37% more positive logs this academic year when compared to the same point last academic year whilst at the same time, receiving 11% less negatives.



We thank all students and parents/carers for their ongoing commitment to ensuring Fairfax is an Ambitious, Respectful, Kind and Safe school for all to achieve well in.

Attendance Matters

We extend our heartfelt thanks to both parents/carers and students for their exceptional attendance this term. Your dedication and ambition to being present and committed towards learning is truly commendable. As a result, we are proud to report that our attendance is nearly 1.5% above national average which is something that everyone who is involved with Fairfax should be immensely proud of.

Research consistently demonstrates a strong correlation between attendance and academic performance, including GCSE and A Level results. Numerous studies have highlighted the positive impact of regular attendance on student achievement. Here are some key findings:

- 1. Improved Academic Performance: Higher attendance rates are associated with better grades. Students who attend classes regularly have more opportunities to engage with the curriculum, participate in discussions, and receive feedback from teachers, all of which contribute to improved learning outcomes.
- 2. Exam Success: Research suggests that students with higher attendance rates are more likely to perform well in standardized tests, including GCSEs and A Levels. Regular attendance ensures that students have covered the necessary material and are adequately prepared for exams.
- 3. Retention of Material: Consistent attendance facilitates the retention of information and skills taught in class. Students who attend regularly are better able to build upon previous lessons, leading to a deeper understanding of the subject matter and increased confidence in their abilities.
- 4. Positive Learning Environment: Schools with high attendance rates often foster a positive learning environment where students feel motivated and supported. This environment encourages active participation and collaboration among peers, further enhancing academic performance.

Overall, the research underscores the importance of attendance in achieving academic success. By prioritizing attendance and minimizing absences, students can maximize their learning potential and achieve their academic goals.

We understand that there will be occasions where students may not be well enough to come to school. On these occasions, please contact the Academy before 08:00 each day of absence.



At Fairfax Academy we believe that excellent attendance and punctuality are the key to success. A missed school day is a lost opportunity to learn. Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve higher grades than students who do not have regular attendance.

Poor punctuality can have a significant Poor punctuality can have a significant impact on learning time. Across a school year, being 5 minutes late per day results in a loss of 3 days learning per year. Being 15 minutes late every day will result in 10 lost days.

Our school day starts at 8.35am and students should be through the school gate at this time. Students that are late into school will be issued with sanctions

Children are required by law to attend School 190 days per year and the Government advise that students' attendance should be at least 95%. However, 95% attendance equates to 10 missed days of school; a massive 50 lessons! Research has shown that students missing 20 days of school performed a whole grade lower in their exams than similar ability students with good attendance.

It has been a busy few weeks of careers activities at Fairfax. At the beginning of March we hosted our Year 9 event 'Guess My Job' and 18 visitors came to school to be quizzed about their job role. It was a very entertaining day with visitors commenting how well behaved and engaged the students were. In student feedback 100% of the students said they enjoyed the event with their favourite careers being either the Magician or the Tree Surgeon!
